OBJECTIVES

1. To provide an educational and recreational activity for 4-H members and the community.
2. To encourage youth and community in developing their ability to condition and show horses.
3. To encourage youth and community in accepting responsibility, developing horsemanship, showmanship, and sportsmanship.

RULES FOR 4-H MEMBERS AND OTHER EXHIBITORS

1. Every animal must be under control at all times and may be disqualified if considered by the judges and/or the committee to be in any way undesirable, untrained, unfit and improperly "turned out".
2. No dogs on the show grounds.
3. Exhibitors shall act as ladies and gentlemen at all times. It is mandatory that exhibitors be polite, good sportsmen, and properly attired in clean and neat clothing - elimination for infraction of this rule shall be the decision of the show committee. Parents and/or chaperon and supporters of an exhibitor must conduct themselves in a proper manner according to 4-H objectives of good sportsmanship and citizenship. Improper action by parent and/or chaperon or other supporters or trainers can result in elimination of the exhibitor at the decision of the show committee.
4. Exhibitor must be responsible for selection, management, and care of his horse.
5. Exhibitor will be responsible for tack, horse, and personal items.
6. No stallions will be permitted.
7. Only authorized persons will be allowed in the ring.
8. Exhibitor must be in proper dress for the classes they are showing in. Boots are required.
Note: Helmets with chin strap properly fastened are strongly recommended inside and outside of the arena. Helmets will be considered proper attire for all classes. All hunter, barrel racing, and pole bending classes will require a helmet. Any entrant 3rd grade or under is required to wear a helmet in any mounted class.
9. Judges decisions will be final.
10. All complaints must be in writing and submitted to the show committee chairman, Grant Palmer.
11. The show committee reserves the right to:
 1. Divide any class if too large.
 2. Combine divisions of a class if they feel there are not enough entries in either division.
 3. Eliminate a class if there are not enough entries. Refunds will be given for any class eliminated by the show committee.

THERE ARE NO REFUNDS FOR SCRATCHED CLASSES

12. A horse may be exhibited in only one Showmanship and Grooming class and in only one halter class.
13. Horses two years of age as of January 1 of the current year cannot be shown in Performance classes.
14. **MUST PRESENT PROOF OF CURRENT NEGATIVE COGGINS TEST BEFORE UNLOADING ON DAY OF SHOW**
15. Horse may show in more than one Division as appropriate. Note Rule 12, though.
16. Other rules as detailed in the Tennessee 4-H Horse Show Handbook apply to 4-H Members.
17. 4-H Exhibitor will not receive assistance from anyone other than 4-H members while on the show grounds. Parents, trainers, etc. may observe but are not allowed to handle the horses unless in an emergency.
18. Registration for any class or event is considered acceptance of the rules. Employees, staff, guests, or sponsors will not be responsible for any accident, injury, or loss which may occur to exhibitors, spectators, horses, or any other animals, vehicles, equipment, or property at any show event and/or activity.
19. High point awards will be given for each division. If an exhibitor is showing more than one horse, points will be awarded on each horse individually. Hunter high point will be determined by placings in classes 1-10 plus Trail and Dressage. Western high point will be determined by placings in classes 12-23 plus Dressage. Walking/racking high point will be determined by placings in classes 29-38 plus Trail and Dressage.
